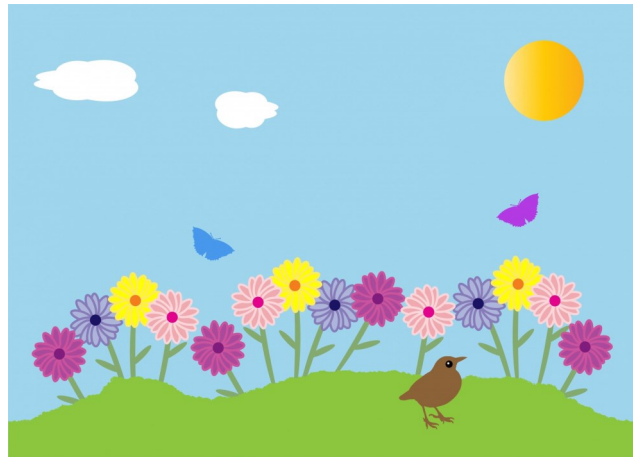

Chairman's Report 2019/20

The parish council has continued to work hard on behalf of the residents of Wheelton against a backdrop of changing planning laws and cuts to local services. This year the council has secured a defibrillator which has been fitted at the Village Hall, and worked with the Lions Running Club and the Golden Lion to ensure that there is a defibrillator accessible in Higher Wheelton.

A visiting post office has been set up at the village hall on Fridays to ensure residents have access to post office services.

On going maintenance and monitoring of our community facilities has seen the parish council replace ageing play equipment, repair walkway lights and site new signage around our public areas.

Parish council representatives ensure that Wheelton issues and priorities are raised with partners and stakeholders through regular meetings and local forums.

I would like to express my gratitude to all the fellow Councillors for their time and hard work representing the community, and all the volunteers that make our village such a good place to live

Local History News

Since retiring from teaching, I have been fascinated by the history of my adopted village, Wheelton, and the surrounding area.

Since writing my book, ten years ago, I have accessed a website called "astreetnearyou" to research details of war deaths in World War One. I thought that this might be of interest to readers of our Parish Newsletter and all you have to do is put in your postcode. This is a site which users can add to so the details which follow are probably not up to date.

I would ask that people living at the addresses below display a poppy and a small card in their window or on their door to remember the soldier who once lived there on Remembrance Day in November.

Below is a list of the war deaths I have recorded, some of which are recorded on the War Memorial and I stress it is by no means exhaustive:

- Lance Cpl. Robert Charles Thompson. Royal Lancs. Regiment. Died aged 28 on 23.10.16. 7 Meadow Street.
- Pvt. Hobert Anglezaeke. Loyal North Lancs. Regiment. Died aged 28 on 13.08.16. 5 Victoria Street.
- Lance Cpl. Robert McClellan. Loyal North Lancs. Regiment. Died aged 28 on 28.04.17. 23 Meadow Street.
- Pvt. Richard Prescott. Loyal North Lancs. Regiment. Died aged 20 on 09.05.15. 31 Meadow Street.
- Pvt Horrocks. Royal Lancs. Regiment. Died aged 28. 1 Bennet Row, Higher Wheelton.
- Pvt. John Snape. South Wales Borderers. Died age 19 on 23.03.18. 8 Albert Street, Wheelton.
- Pvt Herbert Dixon. Loyal North Lancs. Regiment. Died age 23 on 17.06.17. Calendar Cottage, Wheelton.

- Lancs Sgt. Willian Fidler. Kings Liverpool Regiment. Died 19.12.16. 3 Albert Street.
- Pvt. Richard Woodcock. Kings Liverpool Regiment. Died 05.02.19 of wounds. 2 Briers Brow, Wheelton.
- Pvt Norman Rigby. Loyal North Lancs. Regiment. Died aged 19 on 13/09/18. West View, Wheelton.
- Pte. Albert Rigby. Loyal North Lancs. Regiment. Died aged 25 on 26.08.17. Kenyon Lane, Heapey.
- Sapper Cecil Chadwick. Royal Engineers. Died aged 21 on 29.09.17. Kenyon Lane, Heapey. His father possibly taught at Wheelton School.
- Pte. Robert Rigby Grimshaw. Coldstream Guards. Died 31.07.17. 1 Victoria Terrace, Wheelton.
- Pte. James Whittle. Lancashire Fusiliers. Died of wounds 29.09.19. Black Lion Farm, Heapey.

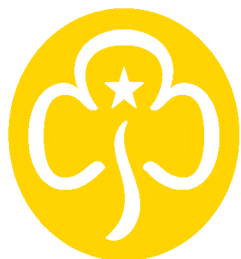

Changes will be made to recycling centres opening hours

Lancashire County Council's cabinet has agreed proposals to help balance its budget by changing the opening times and days of recycling centres.

All 15 Household Waste Recycling Centres (HWRCs) will still be open at the busiest times including weekends and bank holidays, but six of the quieter sites will only open 5 days a week. The opening hours of all recycling centres will be changed to 9am - 5pm all year round.

The sites at Barnoldswick, Burscough, Carnforth, Clitheroe, Haslingden and Longridge will close two days during the week excluding Friday, as this is often the busiest weekday leading into the weekend.

In a change to the original proposals Skelmersdale HWRC will remain open seven days a week. It had been proposed that the Skelmersdale site also open five days a week on the basis that there is another site in West Lancashire at Burscough, however it was accepted that the Skelmersdale site is significantly busier, receiving much more waste than other sites which were due to move to five day opening.

Feedback received during the consultation also led to a new recommendation ensuring that all sites will open on Bank Holidays, even if a facility's normal closure day is a Monday.

The report to cabinet also addressed concerns that reducing availability of the recycling centres would lead to increased fly tipping. It states that most fly tipping is carried out by unscrupulous businesses which do not want to pay for their waste to be disposed of properly. There has been no evidence of fly tipping having increased when Lancashire recycling centres had been closed in the past as the majority of residents care for their local environment and would not risk criminal penalties for fly tipping.

The changes are due to be implemented from 1 October 2019.
