Repeated pipe bursts on Whins Bridge access track.


It has been noted that there have been a number of disruptions over the past several months/couple of years. On the Whins Lane Canal access track.

There have been several bursts on a section of 9" AC (asbestos cement) water main fed from the pumping station adjacent the canal bank. The pump outlet runs at 10 bar to deliver water to the upstream SR (service reservoir) that feeds around 4000 properties.

Engineering reports and detailed modelling has flagged up the need to reinstate the surge vessel (previously removed circa 2017) and modify air valves on the section of pumped main.

There was no mention of timescale to complete these works, but at least there is acknowledgement of an issue that needs resolving.

THE FRIENDS OF FINNINGTON RESIDENTS GROUP



We are a group of residents from across the local villages, of Hoghton, Abbey Village, Brindle, Wheelton, Withnell, Brinscall, Heapey and Livesey, all of which would be severely impacted by the proposed totally inappropriate development, which F1 Real Estate are seeking permission to build at Finnington/Junction 3 of the M65.

If built, these two sheds, each the size of Wembley Stadium would totally decimate our local area, which is steeped in history, and protected Green Belt land, FOREVER.

In order to conduct our campaign successfully, and stop this development from being approved, we need the help of experts, and legal support. Mountain Rescue 2024 Incidents

Brinscall & Rivington is covered by two mountain rescue teams, Bolton Mountain Rescue Team and Bowland Pennine Mountain Rescue Team. The teams are affiliated to Mountain Rescue (England & Wales) (MREW).

All mountain rescue teams are voluntary organisations, receiving no money from central government, and with a need to fundraise to purchase supplies and equipment, which in turn we use to support our community. Each team has to raise around £40,000 to replenish our equipment and keep a roof over our heads.

Each team is mobilised by the 3 main emergency services, although mainly by NWAS, Lancashire Constabulary or Greater Manchester Police. We are occasionally mobilised by Lancashire Fire & Rescue service.

Nationally Mountain Rescue incidents are increasing across the MREW affiliated teams, social media and influencers are posting images people wish to see for themselves. However the number of incidents Bolton and Bowland Pennine are mobilised to has reduced from historical levels.
