<u>Jobs in the garden for Winter</u>

You can plant over wintering onion sets, Broad Beans and Garlic.

December is a good chance for you to prepare your soil, clear weeds and add organic matter to your soil before winter sets in. Collect any fallen leaves from your garden especially your lawn, as they act as a blanket that may encourage moss, bag them up and use them as leaf mould next year.

Remember to feed the birds in your garden and provide fresh water.

Using what3words

Lancashire Fire and Rescue are now using what3words. This means if you get into an accident and are having trouble describing where you are (if you're out walking, for example), you can use the app to tell them your exact location. what3words has labelled every 3m x 3m square in the world with an address made of three random words from the dictionary. For example, the 3 word address of Nelson's Column in Trafalgar Square is ///this.fantastic.notes

All you need to do is download the free what3words app. You'll be able to see and share the 3-word address of your current location and also to find out the 3-word address of your home (by typing in your address and selecting the square containing your front door). If you're renting your property on Airbnb or any other accommodation sites, you can also use it to make sure guests don't get lost by just sending them the 3-word address of the front door/property entrance (especially if your postcode goes to the wrong place!). Visit what3words.com or download the app to find out more.

Here's a few ideas of how else we can be used:

- Reporting the exact location of crimes/incidents to the Emergency Services and local authorities in your area (Cumbria Police and Cumbria Fire and Rescue are all set up to accept a 3-word address on a 999 call)
- Listing a 3-word address on signs and websites to help people find local points of interest and attractions
- Encourage people to use 3-word addresses to help guests find selfcatering/ holiday cottages (eg sending them out on Airbnb / Tripadvisor bookings etc)







The Central Lancashire Authorities of Preston City, South Ribble and Chorley are undertaking a review of the development plans for the area and are working towards the preparation of a Joint Local Plan for Central Lancashire. As part of the forthcoming consultation on the new Local Plan, which will supersede the Core Strategy and the three Local Plans for Chorley, Preston and South Ribble, there will be a Ward Drop In Event for the Central Lancashire Local Plan Issues and Options Consultation at the Heapey and Wheelton Village Hall on Tuesday 17 December 2019 from 4pm to 7pm.

The plan aims to enable the creation of good quality places to live, work and relax over the next 15 years to 2036. This plan will tell the Central Lancashire Local Plan Team how they can improve our area for future generations, reduce the impacts of climate change by being carbon neutral by 2030 and will also be seeking your views on the Council's proposed list of site suggestions for Chorley.

There will be a consultation drop-in event in every Ward in the borough with officers on hand to answer questions and practical tips in using the online portal, explain submission maps and help you share your opinions.

Come along to the drop in to see what is being proposed and how your views of developments in the local area can be heard.

The Lancashire Local Authorities are working together to make homes warmer and healthier through the Cosy Homes in Lancashire (CHiL) scheme delivered by our partner, Rhea Projects.

CHiL currently has funding available for qualifying residents for the following measures:

- First time gas central heating for properties that have never had central heating (to replace solid fuel fires, electric heaters, gas wall heaters)
- Boiler replacements for owner occupiers
- Loft insulation
- Cavity Wall Insulation

Residents qualify if they are on certain means tested benefits or on a low income with health vulnerabilities. Residents can check if they qualify by contacting the CHiL admin hub on 03306 061 488.


